Event Flow & Highlights

List of Games & Descriptions

- Lemon and Spoon Race**

- Guess the Sequence of Objects**
Participants were shown a series of objects in a specific sequence for a few seconds, then asked to recall and recreate the order. This game tested memory and observation skills.
- Pyramid Using Glasses**
In this creative task, teams raced to build the tallest and most stable pyramid using plastic glasses—requiring both teamwork and precision.
- Heads Up!**
A charades-style guessing game where one player held a word on their forehead (without seeing it) while teammates acted it out. This game sparked plenty of laughter and excitement.
