

This course examines the logic and working of organizations. It also investigates how organizations develop and maintain competitive advantage within a changing business environment influenced by political, economic, social, technological, legal and environmental [PESTLE] factors. The course content is organized around the four 'pillars' of management viz. planning, organizing, leading and control [POLC] for systematic understanding of management-related challenges and conceptual tools and techniques in analyzing, evaluating and addressing management issues1.

A Brief Report

The Department of General Management designed, developed and conducted a proficiency course on Problem Solving Methods and Techniques in Management for the second semester MBA students. The course consists of seven modules spread around 15 hours and conducted in 10 sessions of one and a half hour each on every Saturday. The course started from 26th April to 28th June 2014.


The course aimed at inculcating problem solving skills among MBA students to enable them analyze problems, identify problem severity and assess the impact of alternative solutions. Participants learned to use available resources to resolve issues in a constructive manner. Additionally, students had an opportunity to practice far reaching consensus by seeing a problem from a professional, and not from a personal perspective. The course included brainstorming activities and online business simulations. In order to achieve the aim of this course a combination of academia and industry resource people was made. They shared their hands on experience in solving the various levels of problems in the practical scenario.

At the end of the course the students have been graded based on their performance. The criteria for measuring their performance is given below:-





The objectives of this workshop were:


- To inculcate entrepreneurship skills, ethics and values.



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INTRODUCTION

A supply chain or logistics network is the system of organizations, people, technology, activities, information and resources involved in moving a product or service from supplier to customer. Supply chain activities transform natural resources, raw materials and components into a finished product that is delivered to the end customer. In sophisticated supply chain systems, used products may re-enter the supply chain at any point where residual value is recyclable

What is Supply chain management?

A supply chain is the group of components (suppliers, distribution points, transportation providers) necessary to bring product from its raw material state to the end user. Supply chain management is the term used for controlling and regulating supply chain.

Supply chain success just doesn't happen. It takes focus and effort across the entire company/organization and with outside suppliers and service providers. Logistics touches every part of a company. So supply chain management is multidimensional in its approach and scope. And this takes process, people and technology. This is true whether one is wholesaler, retailer or manufacturer. Supply chains can be long and complex, stretching between different countries. A firm may have many customers, each with different order and shipment requirements and destinations. There can be many suppliers, sourced from different cities and many countries. Each supplier may require instructions and planning as to lead times. All this work is done have product available when customers order. There are internal needs too. These include where warehouses should be located, both in the U.S. and internationally; how inventory is forecast and allocated to each warehouse; how orders are handled and shipments prepared and how production is assigned among plants and suppliers

PROCESS. Process means a practice, a series of actions, done for a specific purpose, such as satisfying customers. Customers demand and expect more from their suppliers; that is a fact regardless your size or industry. And supply chain management is critical to that customer satisfaction. Supply chain process is a flow of activities with the goal of meeting the requirements of a customer. It includes all internal functions, logistics, distribution, sourcing, customer service, sales, manufacturing and accounting. It includes external companies. The series flows backward--from delivering each customer order each order as demanded back through the performance of suppliers to provide needed finished products, components, parts and assemblies. Process has structure. This compares what some companies call "process" which may be a series of repetitive, standalone transactions. Process has standardization with its understanding of what must be done. With that in place, it also has flexibility to handle exceptions and changes that are a reality of doing business.

PEOPLE. People make organizations and are important to supply chain success. They need to have functional expertise and skills. They need to know how to manage and operate warehouses, inventory, transportation,

purchasing. They need both a tactical view for everyday business and a strategic vision of where and how their function fits in the supply chain and how to make it better. People success is a function also of the corporate culture, how the company sees itself, defines itself and operates, both internally and externally. The culture can be a facilitator of processes or an inhibitor. If the company has myopia, then it negatively impacts its ability to respond in all areas required. Similarly, organizations, with their hierarchical design, create barriers to supply chain

Sri VijayaChakiSakanika Kendra, Chanpattna Town, Ramanagar.

Sri VijayaChakiSakanika Kendra is a small private industry run by Mr. G M Sunil. It is registered under Karnataka Government.

In this industry the process of sericulture is undertaken. The production process includes:

- 1. The silk moth lays thousands of eggs.
- 2. The silk moth eggs hatch to form larvae or caterpillars, known as silkworms.
- 3. The larvae feed on mulberry leaves.
- 4. Having grown and moulted several times silkworm weaves a net to hold itself
- 5. It swings its head from side to side in a figure '8' distributing the salivar that will form silk.
- 6. The silk solidifies when it contacts the air.
- 7. The silkworm spins approximately one mile of filament and completely encloses itself in a cocoon in about two or three days. The amount of usable quality silk in each cocoon is small. As a result about 2500 silkworms are required to produce a pound of raw silk)
- 8. The silk is obtained by brushing the undamaged cocoon to find the outside end of the filament.
- 9. The silk filaments are then wound on a reel. One cocoon contains approximately 1,000 yards of silk filament. The silk at this stage is known as raw silk. One thread comprises up to 48 individual silk filaments.

RREPORT OF ONE DAY WORKSHOP ON "INDIAN VALUES AND RELEVANCE OF SWAMI VIVEKANANDA'S THOUGHTS TO INDIAN BUSINESS", HELD ON 12/1/17.

PREAMBLE

A one day work shop on the theme "Indian Values And Relevance Of Swami Vivekananda's Thoughts To Indian Business" was held on 12-1-17. The target audience were I sem. MBA students of the college.

The objective of the workshop was to enable the participating students to understand and appreciate the core Indian values which pervade all spheres of activities including business activities. The theme selected for the workshop aimed at the basic concepts of Business and Industry, a subject for I sem. as well as how the thoughts of Swami Vivekananda's could be applied to present day Indian Problems. The day was Swami Vivekananda's birth day also and was celebrated all over India and abroad.

FIRST SESSION

First session was conducted by Dr.V.B.Arathi, Faculty, Academy of Creative Teaching. The theme of the session was "Relevance Of Swami Vivekananda's thoughts to Indian Business and Indian society".Dr.Arathi, elaborated on various thoughts propounded by Swami Vivekananda and brought out their relations to various activities of human beings. The presentation included examples, taken from day- to-day lives of a common man.

Dr.Arathi, delineted the relevance of Swamiji's thoughts, which are as important and relevant today, as they were decades ago. She interacted with the participants, by eliciting their opinions and views, on these thoughts. Participants gave their views and opinions, which were further analyzed for better understanding.

Dr.Arathi, ably answered the questions from the students to their best satisfaction. She concluded the session, by stressing the importance and relevance of Swami Vivekananda's thoughts in all aspects of an average Indian, be it is business, service or profession.

SECOND SESSION

Second session was conducted by Dr.S.Ranganath, a well-known scholar and a Professor at NMKRV College for Women.

Dr.S.Ranganath, conducted the session on the theme "Indian values-Traditional and Contemporary".Dr.Ranganath opened the session by emphasizing the role of values in day- to day life a person. He informed the participants, that values are the undercurrents of all human activities, whether it is one's business or one's profession. He listed the traditional values, which are universal and time tested. He also stressed the importance of these traditional values and stated that it will never erode and it will remain permanent.

The session was an interactive one and the students participated enthusiastically. Several questions were raised by the students and same were answered to the satisfaction of the students.

The presentation by the resource person was interspersed with many quotations of great men and women of India. The whole session was well received by the participants. The session was concluded by the resource person with an appeal to follow the Indian values as they are universal and time tested.

THIRD SESSION

Third session was conducted by Prof.N.Suresh. of RV Institute of Management. The theme for the session was" Management Principles as evident in Bhagavad-Gita"

The resource person, initiated the session, quoting several popular stanzas from Bagavad-Gita.The meanings of these stanzas as understood by a layman and as understood by a scholar were highlighted. The management principles as studied in Business school were identified ,with respect to Bhagavad-Gita.The context in which these principles are to be debated and understood, was also identified. The students were asked compare the western concepts and concepts as seen in Bhagavad-Gita.

The participating students asked several questions and they were answered with the help examples from day- to-day instances. Several anecdotes formed the presentation. The resourse person, gave examples which evidently proved that many management principles as studied now, were a part of Indian life, since time immemorial

Prof.Suresh concluded the session with an appeal to all student participants, to study Bhagvad-Gita, as many times as possible as, new meanings will emerge, each time it was studied.

The session was well received and the feedback was satisfactory. The student participants appreciated the presentation and were satisfied with the intellectual benefits they derived.

REPORT OF ONE DAY WORKSHOP ON "LATEST TRENDS IN OPERATIONS MANAGEMENT", HELD ON 7/12/16

PREAMBLE

A one day workshop was organized for the students of III semester MBA of the college on the theme "Latest Trends in Operation Management", on 7/12/16.The objective of the workshop was to provide an exposure to the latest trends in operations management. Operations management is also studied by these students as part of their curriculum. Thus this workshop aimed at a theme, which not only helps them in appreciating the nuances of the subject but also know the latest trends in operations management. The workshop consisted of three sessions, conducted by experts in these fields

FIRST SESSION

The first session was conducted by Prof.Shobha, faculty, dept. Of Industrial Engineering, RV College Of Engineering, Bangalore. The theme of the session was "Total Quality and its applications". The resource person, explained detail the principles of TQM and also deliberated on its applicability to the business processes.Prof.Shobha explained the concepts with examples as relevant to the present situations in all types of organization and more so in the field of business organizations.

The resource person, pointed out that, quality is an all pervading concept and is not limited to manufacturing only. The session was an interactive session, with questions from the participants as well. All the questions were answered, in detail, with further leads, for a deeper understanding of the topic.

Prof.Shobha, involved the participants, by providing few exercises also. The solutions provided by the participants were discussed and analysed.Prof.Shobha, summarized the outcomes, and urged the students to analyze more problems, involved in establishing a total quality environment.

SECOND SESSION

The second session was also conducted by Prof.Shobha.The theme of the session was "Six Sigma and its Applications". The resource person began the session, by highlighting the importance of adopting six sigma methods in all types of organizations, particularly in business organizations. She enumerated the instances, where in, the companies have reaped the benefits of adopting six sigma approaches, in all their operations.

The session included question and answer session also, with which, the concept was made clearer to the students. Live examples were cited by the resource person, to bring out the essence of six sigma quality approach.

Several exercises were provided, to enable the students to understand the intricacies of the approach. All the solutions provided by the participants were taken up for further deliberations. The strengths and weaknesses of each of the solution were analysed.Prof.Shobha concluded the session, by summarizing the debated issues and giving her comments as an expert.

THIRD SESSION

The third and last session was conducted by Prof.Chandran of RV Institute of Management. The theme for the session was "Work breakdown structure"

Prof.Chandran, introduced the concept of Work breakdown structure as applied to organizational processes. He also highlighted the advantages of Work breakdown structure, in increasing the productivity of the organizations. He cited several examples, to stress the importance of having Work breakdown structure in organizations.

The questions asked by the participating students, were answered in detail. Many more questions were raised by the resource person himself, to elicit the responses, as well as, to initiate further discussion. The students participated in the discussion, and raised several questions, which were answered from all possible angles.

Problems which are likely to be encountered in creating Work breakdown structure were eloborarted.Possible solutions were discussed along with advantages and dis-advantages.Prof.Chandran, concluded the session with an appeal to the students to investigate such approaches in depth, so that Work breakdown structure gains momentum, in all types of operations.

CONCLUSION

The three sessions of the one day workshop covered and examined the important aspects of the latest trends in operations management. The sessions were highly interactive and the participants derived the expected benefits. The participants' feedback was good and they expressed their satisfaction. They

also informed that they look forward to such types of workshops in future also.




