A Report on the celebration

Seminar hall of the institute. Dr. S.R.Leela *Former Professor and Head, Department of Sanskrit,* NMKRV College for women, Bengaluru, and Ex-Member of The Legislative Council, Govt.of.Karnataka, was the chief guest of the function. The programme started with invocation rendered by Smt. Rashmi Shetty, Assistant Professor, and Dept. Of General Management. Sri. N.Suresh Co-ordinator, Sr.Assistant Professor and Co-ordinator for Centre for Indian culture and Heritage, Welcomed the Guest and gathering. Director Dr.T.V. Raju honored the Chief Guest. A brief report on the speech delivered by Dr.S.R.Leela is given below.

Dr.B.R.Ambedkar, popularly known as Babasaheb Ambedkar, was one of the architects of the Indian Constitution. He was a well-known politician and an eminent jurist. Ambedkar's efforts to eradicate the social evils like untouchablity and caste restrictions were remarkable. The leader, throughout his life, fought for the rights of the dalits and other socially backward classes. Ambedkar was appointed as the nation's first Law Minister in the Cabinet of Jawaharlal Nehru. He was posthumously awarded the Bharat Ratna India's highest civilian honour in 1990

Bhimrao Ambedkar was born to Bhimabai Sakpal and Ramji on 14 April 1891 in Madhya Pradesh. He was the fourteenth child of his parents. Ambedkar;s father was a Subedar in the Indian Army and posted at Mhow cantonment, MP. After the retirement of his father in 1894, the family moved to satara. Shortly after, his mother passed away. Four years later, his father remarried and the family shifted to Bombay. Ambedkar cleared his matriculation in 1908. Ambedkar was a victim of caste

discrimination. His parents hailed from the Hindu Mahar caste, which was viewed as "untouchable" by the upper class. Ambedkar got the opportunity to study at the Elphinstone College. Besides clearing all the exams successfully Ambedkar also obtained a scholarship of twenty five rupees a month from the Gayakwad ruler of Baroda, Sahyaji Rao III. Political Science and Economics were the subjects in which he graduated from the Bombay University in 1912. Ambedkar decided to use the money for higher studies in USA. After coming back from the US, Ambedkar was appointed as the Defence secretary to the King of Baroda. With the help of the former Bombay Governor Lord Sydenham, Ambedkar obtained the job as a professor of political economy at the Sydenham College of Commerce and Economics in Bombay. In order to continue his further studies, in 1920 he went to England at his own expenses. There he was awarded D.Sc by the London University. Ambedkar also spent few months at the University of Bonn, Germany, to study economics. On 8 June, 1927, he was awarded a Doctorate by the University of Columbia.

Ambedkar began to find ways to reach to the people and make them understand the drawbacks of the prevailing social evils.

In 1936, Ambedkar founded the Independent Labor Party. In the 1937 elections to the Central Legislative Assembly his party won 15 seats. Ambedkar was appointed on the Defense Advisory Committee and Minister for Labor. His reputation as a scholar led to his appointment as free India's first, Law Minister and chairman of the Committee responsible to draft a constitution.

Death

Since 1954-55 Ambedkar was suffering from serious health problems including diabetes and weak eyesight. On 6 December, 1956 he died at his home in Delhi. Since, Ambedkar adopted the Buddhism as his religion, a Buddhist-style cremation was organized for him. The ceremony was attended by hundreds of thousands of supporters, activists and admirers.


Brief Bio-Data

College for Women (Autonomous College) Bangalore. He was awarded D.Litt., from Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla in 2005 for his Post-doctoral publications on Post Independence Sanskrit Literature. Report

The Centre for Indian Culture and Heritage of R.V. Institute of Management celebrated The Birth Anniversary of Sri Sarada Devi on 13/12/2014, (Saturday). The Programme began with the invocation by Smt. Reshmi Shetty, Assistant professor Dept. General Management. Sri.N.Suresh Coordinator for The "Centre for Indian Culture and Heritage" Welcomed the gathering. Dr.Jyotirmoy Ghosh, Professor, R V Institute of Management, Bangalore, delivered lecture on Sri Mata Sarada Devi on this occasion.

Highlights of his lecture:-

du Jersanii

Respectfully and lovingly known as 'Holy Mother', Sri Sarada Devi, the spiritual consort of **Sri Ramakrishna**, was born on 22 December 1853 in a poor Brahmin family in Jayrambati, a village adjoining Kamarpukur in West Bengal. Her father, **Ramachandra Mukhopadhyay**, was a pious and kind-hearted person, and her mother, **Shyama Sundari Devi**, was a loving and hard-working woman. Sarada Devi had a miraculous birth. Shyama Sundari Devi her mother while on a journey wanted to rest under a Bilba Tree; from the top of which a jewelry clad beautiful small girl came down and put her hand around Shama Sundari's neck and said "Ma I have come to

your home". Shyama Sundari became unconscious at that moment and when she regained her senses she felt she had become pregnant.

Marriage

As a child Sarada was devoted to God, and spent most of her time helping her mother in various household chores like caring for younger children, looking after cattle and carrying food to her father and others engaged in work in the field. She had no formal schooling, but managed to learn the Bengali alphabet. When she was about six years old, she was married to Sri Ramakrishna, according to the custom prevalent in India in those days. However, after the event, she continued to live with her parents, while Sri Ramakrishna lived a God-intoxicated life at Dakshineshwar.

Visit to Dakshineshwar

At the age of eighteen she walked all the way to Dakshineshwar to meet her husband. Sri Ramakrishna, who had immersed himself in the intense practice of several spiritual disciplines for more than twelve years, had reached the highest state of realization in which he saw God in all beings. He received Sarada Devi with great affection, and allowed her to stay with him. He taught her how to lead a spiritual life while discharging her household duties. They led absolutely pure lives, and Sarada Devi served Sri Ramakrishna as his devoted wife and disciple, while remaining a virgin nun and following the spiritual path.

Life at Dakshineshwar

Sri Ramakrishna looked upon Sarada Devi as a special manifestation of Divine Mother of the universe. In 1872, on the night of the Phala-harini-Kali-puja, he ritualistically worshipped Sarada Devi as the Divine Mother, thereby awakening universal Motherhood latent in her. When disciples began to gather around Sri Ramakrishna, Sarada Devi learned to look upon them as her own children. The room in which she stayed at Dakshineshwar was too small to live in and had hardly any amenities; and on many days she did not get the opportunity of meeting Sri Ramakrishna. But she bore all difficulties silently and lived in contentment and peace, serving the increasing number of devotees

Who, came to see Sri Ramakrishna.

Leading the Sangha after the Master's Passing

After Sri Ramakrishna's passing away in 1886, Sarada Devi spent some months in
pilgrimage, and then went to Kamarpukur where she lived in great privation. Coming
to know of this, the disciples of Sri Ramakrishna brought her to Kolkata. This marked
a turning point in her life. She now began to accept spiritual seekers as her disciples,
and became the open portal to immortality for hundreds of people. Her great universal
mother-heart, endowed with boundless love and compassion, embraced all people
without any distinction, including

many who had lived sinful lives.

When the Western women disciples of **Swami Vivekananda** came to Kolkata, the Holy Mother accepted them with open arms as her daughters, ignoring the restrictions of the orthodox society of those days. Although she had grown up in a conservative rural society without any access to modern education, she held progressive views, and whole-heartedly supported Swami Vivekananda in his plans for rejuvenation of India and the uplift of the masses and women. She was closely associated with the school for girls started by Sister Nivedita. She spent her life partly in Kolkata and partly in her native village Jayrambati. During the early years of her stay in Kolkata, her needs were looked after by Swami Yogananda, a disciple of Sri Ramakrishna. In later years her needs were looked after by another disciple of Sri Ramakrishna, Swami Saradananda, who built a new house for her in Kolkata.

Simplicity and forbearance:

Although she was highly venerated for her spiritual status, and literally worshipped as the Divine Mother, she continued to live like a simple village mother, washing clothes, sweeping the floor, bringing water from the pond, dressing vegetables, cooking and serving food. At Jayrambati she lived with her brothers and their families. They gave her endless troubles but, established as she was in the awareness of God and in Divine Motherhood, she always remained calm and self-possessed, showering love and blessings on all who came into contact with her. As Sister Nivedita stated, "Her life was one long stillness of prayer."

Mother of all:

In the history of humanity there has never been another woman who looked upon herself as the Mother of all beings, including animals and birds, and spent her whole life in serving them as her children, undergoing unending sacrifice and self-denial. About her role in the mission of Sri Ramakrishna on earth, she stated: "My son, you know the Master had a maternal attitude (matri-bhava) towards every one. He has left me behind to manifest that Divine Motherhood in the world." To her disciples she was the universal mother who said "My son, if a thorn pricks your foot, it hurts me like a spear entering my heart. Never fear and whenever you are in distress just say to yourself, "I have a mother".

Ideal Women


On account of her immaculate purity, extraordinary forbearance, selfless servic unconditional love, wisdom and spiritual illumination, Swami Vivekananda regarded Sri Sarada Devi as the ideal for women in the modern age. He believed that with the advent of Holy Mother, the spiritual awakening of women in modern times had begun. She was ideal universal woman as she said "I tell you one thing - if you want peace, do not find fault with others. Rather see your own faults. Learn to make the whole world your own. No one is a stranger, my child; the whole world is your own."

Last days:

Under the strain of constant physical work and self-denial and repeated attacks of malaria, her health deteriorated in the closing years of her life, and she left the mortal world on 21 July 1920.



Sri Sarada Devi(1853-1920)is known as the Holy Mother among the devotees and admirers and was the spiritual consort of Sri Ramakrishna Paramahamsa who is worshiped as an God incarnate all over the world. Sri Ramakrishna revealed her as an incarnation of Goddess Sarasvati who came to remove ignorance of the suffering humanity.



"You see, my dear, many people seek God only after disappointment in other spheres. But he, who from childhood can place at the Master's feet a heart as pure as a flower, is blessed indeed!"







Report on Kanakadasa Jayanthi held on 08-11-2014 (Saturday).

The Centre for Indian Culture and Heritage" of R.V. Institute of Management celebrated <u>Kanakadasa</u> Jayanthi on 08-11-2014 (Saturday). The Programme began with the invocation by Smt. Reshmi Shetty, Assistant professor Dept. General Management. The resource person for the programme was Sri. N.Suresh, Senior Assistant Professor, and Coordinator for the Centre for Indian Culture and Heritage of R.V.Institute of Management. The following were the highlights of his speech.-

1) Kanakadasa is one of the greatest musician, composer, poet, social reformer, and philosopher and saints that India has ever seen. He was born to the Kurubagowda couple. Father was Biregowda and Mother was Beechamma. His birth name was Thimmappa Nayaka. No biographical details of Kanakadasa are available. Tradition made him a member of shepherd (Kuruba) community who as chief (nayaka) of security forces under a local king. His family deity or the deity he worshipped was Adikeshava of Kaginele, presently in Haveri district. Kaginele, now a village, was a prosperous place and trade center in middle Ages. Thimmappa Nayaka became Kanaka Nayaka after finding huge wealth underneath the ground. Defeat in war made him to renounce the worldly life and became a dasa of Krishna. From then on he was called Kanakadasa. He belonged to the tradition of Haridasa literary movement which ushered in an era of devotional literature in Karnataka. Haridasa' stands for 'servant of Hari', Krishna (incarnation of Vishnu).





- 3) Out of the many of his compositions, about 240 are fully accountable today. All his Karnataka music compositions end with mudra (signature) *Kaginele Adhikeshava*. In addition to being a poet he worked as a social reformer by down playing dogmatic communities that were suppressing the disadvantaged communities. Kanakadasa made extreme effort in reforming the disadvantaged communities by convincing them to give-up their age old obsolete social practices and adapt to the changing world. He effectively used music to convey his philosophy. He lived at Tirupathi in his last days.
- 5) Kanakana Kindi (window of Kanaka) enjoys a special place at the Shri Krishna temple of Udupi. Kanakadasa, who was a non-Brahmin, wanted to have a 'darshan (encounter) of the idol. He was not allowed into the shrine by orthodox people, as Kanakadasa was not a Brahmin by birth. Kanakadasa then started singing praise of Shri Krishna in a corner outside the temple and was lost to outside worldin deep ecstasy. Suddenly there was a breach in the wall, where Kanaka stood, and Lord Krishna offered full darshan bending towards poet. A small window was constructed at the breach later. The idol is still bending even today. Today that window stands as a tribute to the unique saint of Karnataka. Almost all devotees who visit Udupi Krishna temple try to have a peep at the idol, through this window.

- Never mixed issues in life.
- Happiness is catalyst agent in our system, happiness is a creative force and not a destructive force. Hence one should always try to be happy and cheerful. Be unreasonably happy and achieve success
- Swamiji referred HR as Happy Relations

Swamiji concluded his session by saying that "Be happy without any reason" and invited question from the students. The students enjoyed the session. They also posed question to the Swamiji which were answered appropriately. At the end of the session Swamiji requested one girl and one boy to come forward and share




