






Day 1 - August 1, 2019 - Each one Teach One

It is an initiative to encourage jobbers and street vendors to use their signature instead of thumb impression. The vegetable vendors, fruit vendors, push cart and auto drivers, Municipality hygiene and sanitary staff all aspire to develop writing skills. Due to poor or no education background they tend to be illiterate but manage their work or business in a humble way. Dr.Anupama Malagi, Professor, Dr.Narasima Venkatesh, Associate Professor, Ms.Anitha D'Silva, Sr.Assistant Professor, Ms.Anupama, Librarian and Ms.Uma & Ms.Ramya, Assistant Professors visited jobbers and street vendors in Jayanagar 9th Block to teach them to write their names and sign. Students in hostel engaged their time to teach their helping staff.

Few students interacted with the visually challenged person having his small business in front of the college. This opportunity was supportive to exchange ideas and understand the challenges of real world. The visually challenged person in turn taught the students to understand and learn Braille.



Day 2 - August 2, 2019 - Dental Camp





Dental and all associated problems with the gums are to be attended at the earliest to minimize the damages. In most cases delay may cause cavity and loss of teeth. The Dental Camp had a unique imitative this year. The complete Dental Camp was organized by Group D Staff (Helping Staff) in RVIM. The Group- "D" is considered as the lowest rank of Job Post in any Government or Private Jobs. Keeping aside all assumptions, the opportunity to make arrangements for the camp was provided to Group D Staff. This provided an opportunity and also encouraged all to participate in the National Management Week.

The arrangements for the camp were made by Ms.Mamatha, Group D Staff. She was able to reach 153 and made the camp a great success. The other Group D Staff included Ms.Suvarnamma ,Ms.Sashikala.

The medical support for oral health screening was provided by DAPM R.V. Dental College. The posters invitation was sent to students in e format. The shops and residential and public place gathering in nearby hotels and bus shelters were reached to inform the public about the camp on the day.

Day 2 - August 2, 2019 - Visit to Cancer Hospital



Ms.Anitha ,Sr.Assistant Professor and students Divya ,Sharanappa and Karthik visited the learning centre for cancer affected children in Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology. The volunteers interacted with the children there and engaged their class and spent some time in play. Most of the children here come from far off places and stay in the hospital for a considerable duration for their treatment. They are not able to pursue their academics as they have to travel to Bangalore now and then for treatment. This learning centre provides them an opportunity to keep track of their academics.

The programme was possible with the support of 'Samiksha' an NGO working for the oncological children.

The 'Kapur Children Block houses around 50 children. All reading and play materials are provided by the NGO here. RVIM has raised Rs.2500 to donate for the purchase of toys for the little children.


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Day 3 - August 3, 2019 - Road Safety

Day 4-August 4, 2019 - Carbon Footprint Awareness using Artwork



Day 5-August 5, 2019 – Visit to Old Age Home






