Academic Papers: Crafting A Manuscript


- Six Major Components
- · Introduction and Motivation
 - The problem should have broad practical and academic relevance.
 - · Should be generalizable.
- · Literature Review
 - It is not copy paste job.
 Relevant vs. Irielevant literature.
- Hypothesis Development
 - · Innutive vs. Non-intuitive hypothesis.
 - · Literature is not hypothesis.
- · Methodology

WHERE DOES A PROBLEM STATEMENT ORIGINATE FROM?

- A good problem originates from a research question formulated out of observation of the reality.
- A literature review and a study of previous experiments, and research, are good sources of research questions that are converted to statements of problem.
- Many scientific researchers look at an area where a previous researcher generated some interesting results, but never followed up. It could be an interesting area of research, which nobody else has fully explored.

Anchor on theory or phenomenon?

- Most scholars develop identity along one axis
 - -- Rows are theoretical perspectives
 - Columns are phenomena
- Typically, management papers are at the interface
 - A theoretical perspective and a phenomenon
