A step-by-step guide on writing a well-defined research problem statement was presented. Dr. Singh emphasized clarity, focus, and the importance of contextualizing the problem within existing academic literature. She provided templates and examples to help participants articulate research problems effectively.

To make the session more engaging, Dr. Singh introduced real-world scenarios and research abstracts for group discussions. Participants worked collaboratively to identify, refine, and define research problems, applying the techniques they had learned during the seminar.

The seminar concluded with an interactive Q&A segment where attendees sought personalized advice on their research ideas. Dr. Singh provided insightful feedback and actionable suggestions, further enriching the learning experience.
