Introduction

RV Institute of Management (RVIM) stands as a prominent MBA institution in Bengaluru, dedicated to equipping students to meet the dynamic challenges of the industry while instilling strong values and ethics. RVIM offers a comprehensive developmental approach, fostering socio-economic and environmental awareness.

Aligned with this core philosophy, RVIM organized a two-day student development program on Environment, Social & Governance (ESG) for the 2022-24 batch of students. This program encompassed an array of elements, including sensitization on critical social issues, engaging activities, examination of case studies, and a deep dive into the world of Sustainability. Moreover, it involved extensive research on non-governmental organizations (NGOs) to expose students to the various initiatives and endeavors undertaken by these social organizations.

This program was developed in collaboration with "LetsTagOn," an organization dedicated to providing youth with opportunities for social impact through sensitization, social immersions, internships, and volunteering experiences.

The program took place on the 4th September 2023, 6th and 10th of October 2023, for all three sections of students. Importantly, it served as the foundational stepping stone for the subsequent two-week social immersion program that each student is required to partake in. The primary objective was to equip and orient students toward social causes and initiatives, ensuring they approach their social immersion projects with the right mindset and the necessary skills.


Students learning Sign Language


Students enjoyed session on basics of Sign and inclusion. Language **Bridging** the communication gap and creating a more inclusive environment was the message driven during the session.

Learning through case studies is a powerful educational approach that involves the in-depth examination of real-world scenarios or situations. Case studies offer a hands-on and practical way to understand complex concepts, analyze problems, and develop critical thinking skills. This helps in develop problem-solving skills by considering various factors and consequences. Students worked on various rural case studies and represented the cases in the form of posters.

Understanding the Case, identifying root causes using Fishbone diagram, analyzing the solutions and discussing the impacts. Students got a glimpse of the rural problems, how are government and social organizations working towards the betterment of the society. This can inspire learners and give them a deeper appreciation for the practical applications of their studies.

Volunteering

Volunteering brings the students closer to the community and makes them understand that they are contributing for the betterment of the community. Students were taught to make paper covers as an volunteering activity.







Students were asked to distribute the paper covers to the fruit vendors and vegetable vendors on the street. Few students successfully completed the task by distributing the covers. Students were also told to interact with the vendors and create awareness on using paper covers over plastic covers.

Finding NGOs

As part of their Social Immersion Program, since the students are expected to visit the Social organizations and work on a project in the social sector, as a prerequisite, students were asked to study and research various NGOs. Students had to update the information related to the NGOs which they intend to visit later.

Students were asked to find the NGOs based on a cause which they personally connect to. Students selected Primary cause and Secondary causes. Education, Children, Animal welfare, Environment and Elderly care were widely selected. This list can be a good reference for the students as well as the institute. Students have updated the details of the social organisations along with their location and contact. Students can call the NGOs, seek their permissions, and further proceed with the project.

Students had to study the NGOs through their websites and social media pages. The excel sheet which has the details of the NGOs is placed on the drive and here are the links for the drives which hold the list of the NGOs which the students have shortlisted for themselves.




More than 85% of the students intend to take up volunteering

Would you take your volunteering journey forward after this program? 112 responses




Students express how the program helped them to develop critical attitudes
