Findings of the research study

- 1. 77% of the pre-schools have been established after 2006 and nearly 50% of the pre-schools have day care facility.
- 2. Majority of the pre-schools (77%) are not feeder schools to any mainstream school.
- 3. Most of the pre-schools (80%) have a student-Teacher ratio as 10:1

- 4. In terms of curriculum followed, it is observed that most of the pre-schools (68%) follow blended/ integrated method and 95% of the pre-schools have life skills integration.
- 5. In terms of infrastructure facilities, most of the pre-schools are found to have adequate facilities and sufficient play area (around 85%); adequate safety measures (99%); library facility (81%); ICT enabled classrooms (75%); age specific learning materials (94%) and have a well-equipped pantry and dining area.
- 6. Nearly 70% of the schools have their own transport facility
- 7. Almost all the pre-schools have basic medical facility and nearly 60% of the schools have a nurse on site.
- 8. Very few schools (9%) have meal/ snack included and they have their own meal chart.
- 9. Majority of the schools (69%) have teaching staff with minimum qualification of bachelor's degree with either Montessori or Nursery Teachers Training.
- 10. Very few schools (9%) provide quarterly training to their teaching staff.
- 11. Majority of the pre-schools (69%) charge an annual fee up to Rs. 75,000/-
- 12. Nearly 60% of the schools admit children with special needs but very few of them have trained special educators.
- 13. Very few schools (5%) have shadow teachers.
- 14. In 63% of the schools, admission process happens during February to May.
- 15. Observations of enumerators are as follows:
- i. 49% of the pre-schools were rated good and 45% of the pre-schools were rated excellent on infrastructure facilities
- ii. 65% of the pre-schools were rated good and 22% of the pre-schools were rated excellent on quality of staff.
- iii. 70% of the pre-schools were rated good and 16% of the pre-schools were rated excellent on maintenance and hygiene.
