Aditya completed 2 weeks of volunteering service on 8th Jan 2023 as part of Social Immersion program.





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

Introduction to theNGO



Keshava Kripa Samvardhana Samiti (KKSS) registered under societies act of Karnataka in 1963, carries out various seva activities as an NGO.

Abhyudaya, a project under KKSS started its first Free Learning Centre (FLC) with 12 students in 2004. Currently, Abhyudaya reaches out to more than 4,000 students, spread across 150+ FLC in remote villages and slum clusters of Bengaluru through life skills, value-based education and healthcare related activities. Socially deprived children, their families and the neighbourhood become the focus group of Abhyudaya activities as education has to be imparted holistically. They believe, it is their solemn duty to educate children for the benefit of the society and country at large.

Keshava Kripa Samvardhana Samiti (KKSS) is registered with Indian Government NITI Aayog in NGO-Darpan platform under registration # KA/2018/0188905



Major Activities of the NGO:

ABHYUDAYA is engaged in various social welfare activities in the field of education and health.

Abhyudaya's key activities include -

- After-School-Support to Primary and High school children through Kalika Kendras (Free Learning Centres FLC)
- Special coaching to SSLC (X Grade students) through Jnanagiri
- Financial support to deserving students at all levels through Vidyanidhi
- Other Social reach-out programs from Abhyudaya include: Chetana, Namma Shaale, Aarohana, Rudhira and Parivartana

Cause identified: Education

Specific problem: Lack of educational opportunities to the socially deprived children.

CHAPTER 2 – PLAN OF ACTION (Length of the chapter 1-2 pages)

How NGO is addressing these issues

• KALIKA KENDRA (Free Learning Center – FLC)

Abhyudaya is currently reaching out to about 2,000 socially deprived children through more than 100+ Kalika Kendras (Free Learning Center – FLCs) spread around Bengaluru. The Activities at these FLCs in the respective localities are overseen by 135 local teachers and about 25 mentors.

Primary and High school children, majority of whom are from Government schools are engaged for two hours daily at these FLCs after school hours with a view to keep them off the streets. During these hours, the teachers help the children with their homework assignments and aid them to attain the expected academic level for their respective grades. Periodic assignments are done for the kids and their progress is discussed with their respective school teachers and parents.

In addition to the academic activities, children are encouraged / coached to participate in quiz competitions, sports and cultural activities. Counselling sessions are held on personal hygiene and community health for children as well as their parents. Periodic workshops are held to inculcate values, ethics and social responsibilities. Educational and recreational tours are also conducted.

The teachers from these FLCs are regularly upgraded in terms of course content, teaching methodologies and interpersonal skills through monthly workshops. Periodic assessments are conducted to evaluate teachers' progress as well.

• JNANAGIRI

This is an initiative started in 2014 to conduct Free Coaching classes for Grade X (SSLC) students from economically backward sections.

Activities include Personality Development and Career Counselling sessions over the weekends. Each year, more than 250 students are benefiting from this program, some of whom have progressed to professional studies. A handful of these students



have become resource persons for the ongoing Jnanagiri activities.

• VIDYANIDHI

Vidyanidhi is Abhyudaya's endeavour to provide financial support to academically bright children from low-income families who would otherwise be forced to drop out of school due to economic constraints. Vidyanidhi is disbursed once a year to cover the costs of school fees, conveyance, uniforms and stationery.

Applications are invited from Kalika Kendras, selected schools and colleges of Bengaluru. The selection process is methodical and applicants are verified by a team of volunteers before shortlisting them for final selection.

CHAPTER 3 – IMPLEMENTATION REPORT:

CAUSE: EDUCATION

Identification of problem: Lack of educational opportunities to the deprived students

Problems faced in education by underprivileged children:

- **Poverty:** Children living in poverty often lack access to basic necessities, including education. They may not have the resources to afford school fees, uniforms, books, and transportation. Additionally, children living in poverty may have to work in order to help support their families, which can prevent them from attending school.
- Lack of Resources: Schools in underdeveloped areas may not have the necessary resources to provide quality education. This includes a shortage of textbooks, a lack of technology and equipment, and inadequate facilities such as classrooms and libraries.
- **Inadequate Infrastructure:** Schools in rural areas may not have proper infrastructure like electricity, sanitation facilities, and access to clean water, which can make it difficult to provide a safe and comfortable learning environment.
- **Discrimination and Inequality:** Children from certain ethnic, racial, or religious groups may face discrimination and inequality in terms of access to education. This can include discriminatory policies and practices, as well as cultural and linguistic barriers.
- Lack of Access to Quality Teachers: Schools in underdeveloped areas may not have access to qualified, trained teachers, which can negatively impact the quality of education provided. Additionally, high turnover rates among teachers can also affect the continuity of education.
- **Socio-Economic Factors:** Children from low-income families may not have the same opportunities for education as those from more affluent families. This includes access to the best schools, extracurricular activities, and other resources that can help support their education.
- **Political and Policy Issues:** Underfunding of schools and lack of access to education in certain areas can also be caused by political and policy issues. This can include a lack of government support, insufficient funding, or policies that restrict access to education for certain groups of people.

Ways to resolve this issue:

- Building and maintaining schools and other educational facilities in underprivileged communities.
- Providing educational materials and supplies, such as textbooks and school uniforms.
- Offering teacher training and professional development programs.
- Supporting programs that target specific groups, such as girls' education programs or programs for children with disabilities.
- Offering after-school programs and extracurricular activities to supplement formal education.
- Provide scholarships and financial aid to students who may not have the means to pay for their education.
- working with and lobbying government to provide and improve education facilities, policies and teacher training.
- Creating and implementing adult literacy programs and vocational training opportunities.
- Collaborating with other organizations and groups to increase the impact and sustainability of educational efforts.

Actions currently taken by Abhyudaya:

• Kalika kendra (Free Learning Center – FLC)

Abhyudaya is currently reaching out to about 2,000 socially deprived children through more than 100+ Kalika Kendras (Free Learning Center – FLCs) spread around Bengaluru. The Activities at these FLCs in the respective localities are overseen by 135 local teachers and about 25 mentors.

• Jnanagiri

This is an initiative started in 2014 to conduct Free Coaching classes for Grade X (SSLC) students from economically backward sections.

Activities include Personality Development and Career Counseling sessions over the weekends. Each year, more than 250 students are benefiting from this program, some of whom have progressed to professional studies.

• Vidyanidhi:

Vidyanidhi is endeavour to provide financial support to academically bright children from low-income families who would otherwise be forced to drop out of school due to economic constraints. Vidyanidhi is disbursed once a year to cover the costs of school fees, conveyance, uniforms and stationery.

Suggestions:

- Currently Abhyudaya is not able to provide tuition classes during every week days as its completely dependent on volunteers as a teaching staff.
- It can utilise the professional or more experienced teachers for higher classes such as SSLC and can utilise other senior volunteers as teachers for other classes
- In events like Arohana, groups are not properly formed and work is not properly delegated among the volunteers, this leads into some confusion during the event.
- Abhyudaya can utilise its social network in order to create awareness and also can help in providing work opportunities to the students after their education
- They need to organise weekly competition among small children in order to reduce the absenteeism among them.
- And also, should focus on providing career-oriented skills to the PU and undergraduate students




